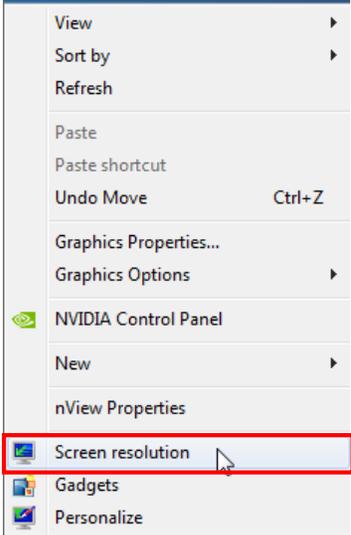


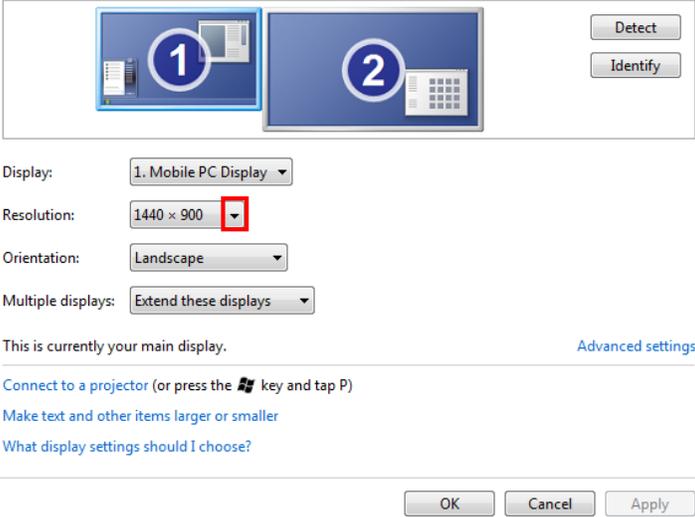
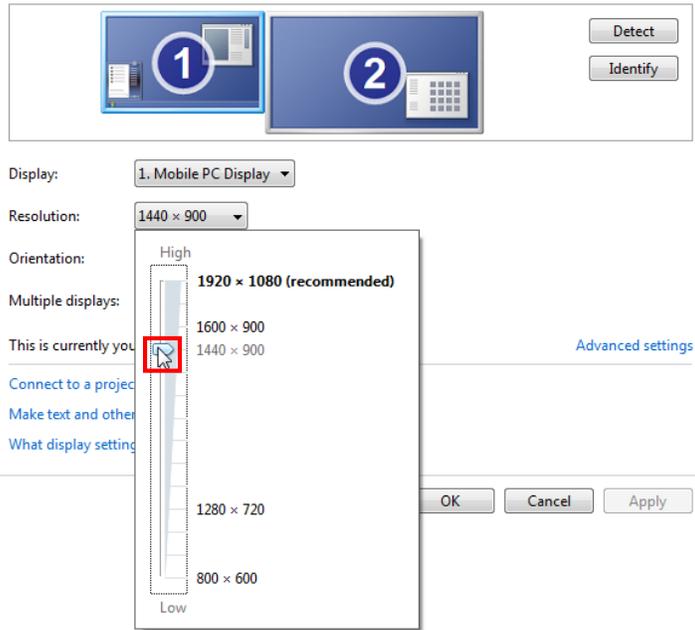
Adjusting Monitor Resolution

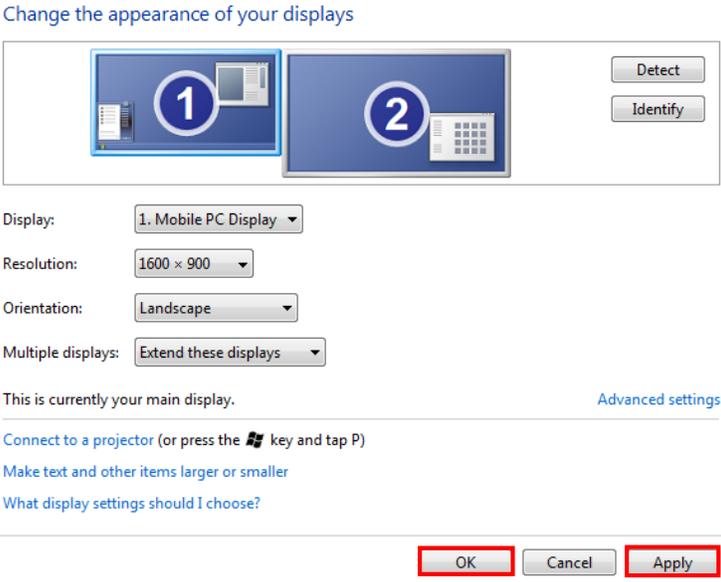
When visiting the wise.statewic.net, you may encounter the "Tiny Screen". To correct this issue you will have to make an overall resolution change by changing the settings on your display monitor. This work instruction will walk you through the process.

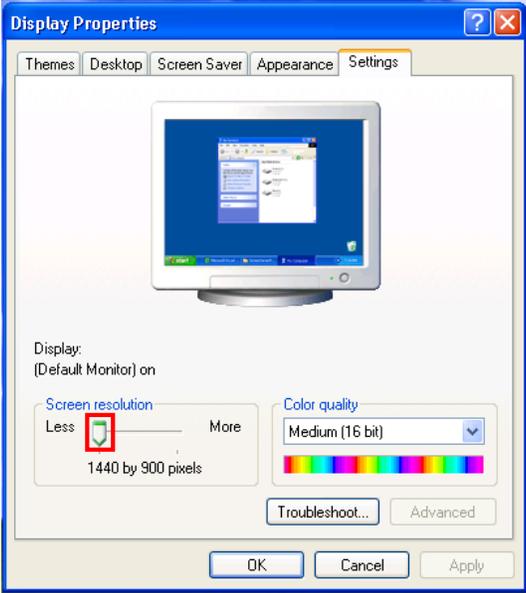
NOTE: It is not recommended to set your monitor display below 1024 X 768.

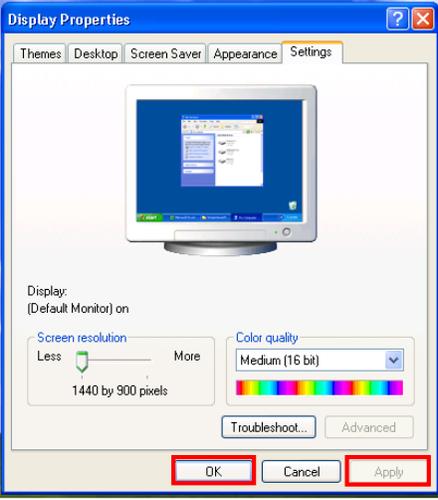

Step	Action	Result
